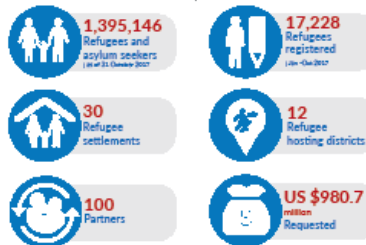

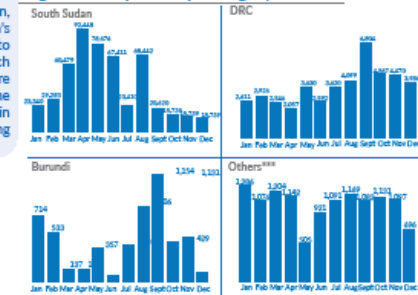
Uganda Refugee Response - Monthly Snapshot

January 2018

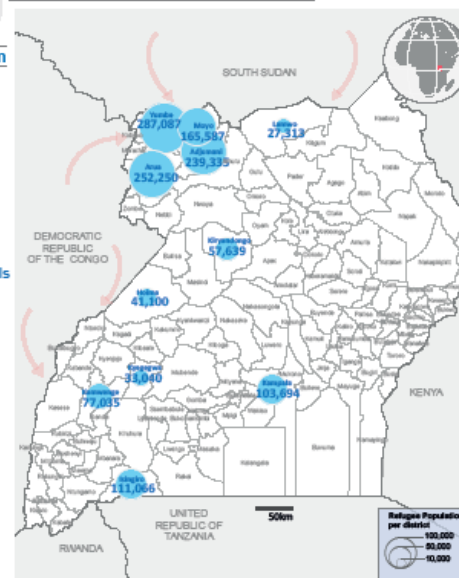


Since gaining independence in 1962, Uganda has provided asylum to people fleeing war and persecution in neighboring countries, especially South Sudan, Democratic Republic of Congo, Somalia, Rwanda and Burundi. Uganda's progressive refugee policy grant refugees freedom of movement, the right to seek employment and establish businesses, and to access public services such as education, health care and justice. In refugee-hosting districts, services are integrated with government service delivery systems, whenever feasible. The Comprehensive Refugee Response Framework for Uganda was launched in March 2017, with a view to harness a whole-of-society approach in responding and finding solutions to refugee crises.

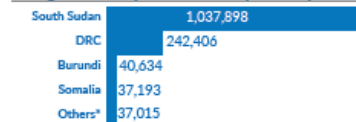
Registration by country of origin | Jan - Dec 2017**

Refugees and asylum seekers by country of origin

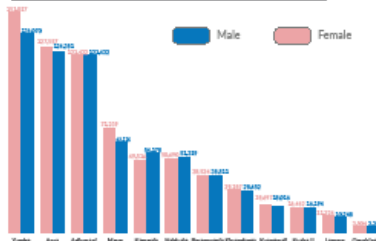

Refugees and asylum seekers demographics

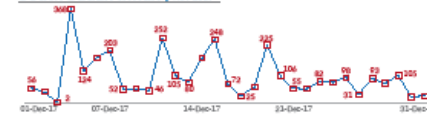


Gender breakdown of registered refugees

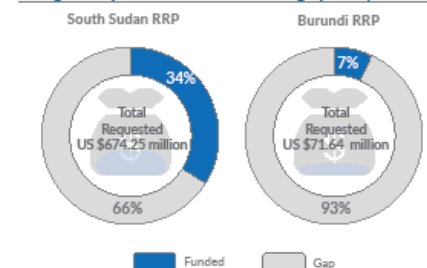

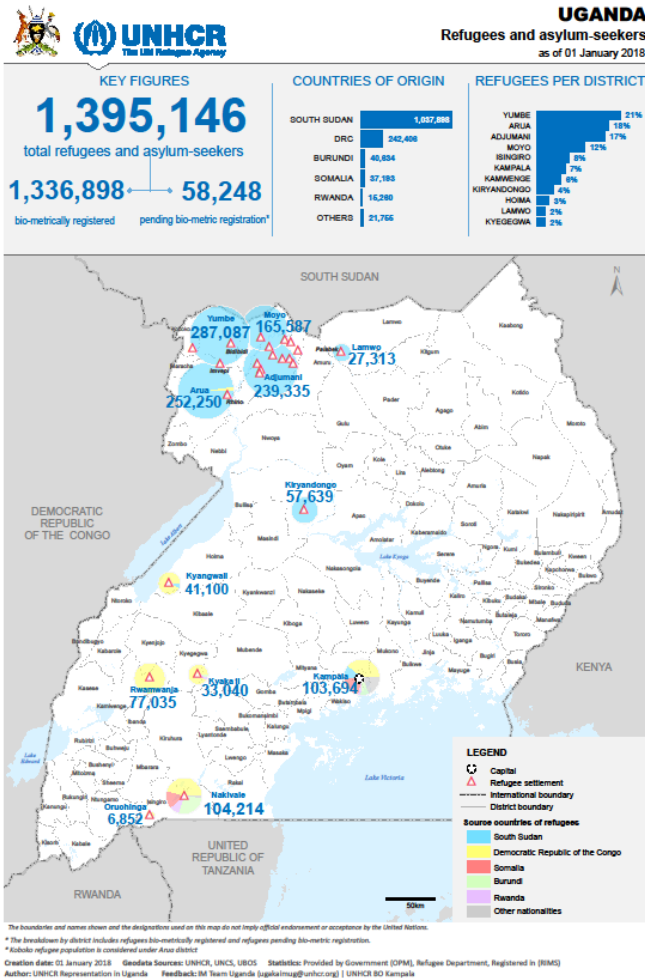

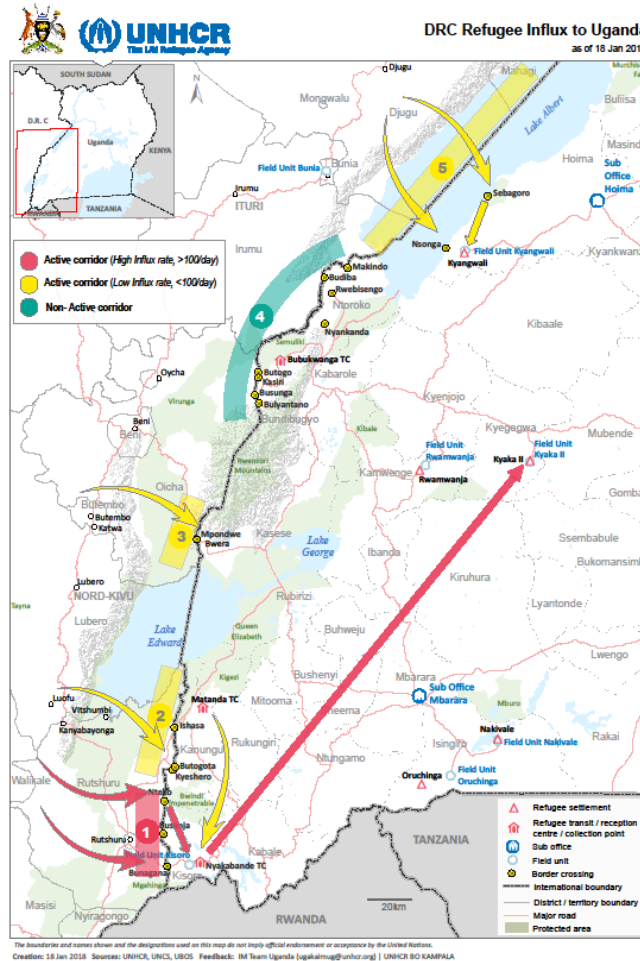

ISOLATION UNIT FOR CANCER CARE CENTRE



BACKGROUND AND JUSTIFICATION

Until December 1, 2016 when the Cancer Care Centre (CCC) was opened as a new department of Kilimanjaro Christian Medical Centre (KCMC), a referral and teaching hospital in Moshi, all cancer patients from the Northern Region had to travel some 600km to Ocean Road in Dar es Salaam, to the only comprehensive Cancer Institute in the country. Many patients were too sick for such a long journey nor could they afford the cost. Hence the majority, many of whom were young children, died without any treatment. CCC is currently the second comprehensive Cancer Centre in Tanzania. It serves a population of estimated 15 million people.

Though it has only limited staff (2 Oncologists, 1 Haematologist, 1 pharmacist, 4 nurses) and infrastructure (1 outpatient clinic with an infusion centre), since it opened on December 1, 2017, it has served more than 1,000 cancer patients so far since it was opened. Of These 400 received chemotherapy to treat the disease, to reduce its burden and to prolong their lives.

FOOTBRIDGES ON THE SLOPES OF MT. KILIMANJARO



BACKGROUND AND JUSTIFICATION

Mwika is located on the southeastern slopes of Mount Kilimanjaro, the tallest free-standing mountain in Africa. Many streams flow down its slopes. Footbridge which people use to cross them are typically made of wood. These are strong when they are new but with frequent rains and constant moisture they rot quickly making them precarious to cross for those who use them every day, especially for the little ones, the old and the sick.

When the bridges have weakened much, they get invariably get carried away in flash floods. Children have to skip school; sick people forego treatment and inoculation of babies and young children are delayed. Women who used to cross the bridge carrying bananas on their heads to the market must hire motorbike taxis to take a long route at a cost which takes bite into their income.

Why shape up a school?

The GOOD news: In 2016, H.E John Pombe Magufuli declared free education for all primary school students and urged all parents to send their children to school. The school enrollment increased drastically

The NOT-SO-GOOD news: The education system is now struggling to deliver quality education. The schools are overcrowded, high teacher pupil ratio and inadequate learning facilities and resources. Therefore, this is compromising the future of the students who are already from disadvantaged communities - majority of the students are from low income families as those with resources opt for private schools.

The INITIATIVE: The Rotary Club of Dar es Salaam - Mikocheni is on a mission to give the young people from poor neighborhoods a shot at a successful future life by improving their access to quality primary school education.

The first school- Mkunguni Primary school

Our first school to shape up is Mkunguni primary school, a public school under the Municipal Council which relies on Government funding to run the school. The school has 1,244 pupils, (boys 598 and girls 646) and 34 teachers.

MICROFINANCE PROJECT PHASE IV

Economic and community development

BACKGROUND AND NEEDS ASSESSMENT

Mwika is a rural community on the Southeastern slopes of Mount Kilimanjaro. It comprises of 11 villages spread over about 64 sq. km (24.7 sq. miles). Its population of about 41,000 is predominantly smallholder farmers. Bananas, beans, corn and avocados are their main sources income. More recently, dairy farming has started to catch on.

No Banks. Mwika has perhaps the largest rural market in the whole of Northern Tanzania, built with support of Rotary New Zealand. Yet Mwika has no bank, only informal Savings and Credit Societies (SACCOS) with little if any external oversight.

Earlier Micro-finance interventions. Mwika Rotary had a successful Micro-finance project for market women in the past. Within few years the number of participants grew from 100 to more than 300, and the level of borrowing which was pegged to the balance in borrowers' savings account, rose from USD20 to USD200 for about one quarter of its participants. The impact on participants' business and homes was significant and visible.

Julieth Ngowi, by no means an exception, is a good example how the project was a life changer for women. A petty trader, with lower borrowing cost for working capital, her business grew rapidly as did her savings. That increased her capacity to
